Q: What is included in my registration?

A: Your registration provides you access to the Day 1 investment briefing. As well as the Day 2 in-person conference, including morning tea, lunch, afternoon tea, gala dinner with keynote speeches, panels and networking.

Travelling to Ho Chi Minh City

The closest airport to the Summit is Ho Chi Minh City's Tan Son Nhat International Airport (SGN).

Venue

The Summit will be held at the InterContinental Saigon located at: Corner Hai Ba Trung St. & Le Duan Blvd, District 1, Ben Nghe Ward, HCMC.

Accommodation

Delegates can book discounted accommodation at the InterContinental Saigon here.

Transport to InterContinental Saigon

We would recommend using '<u>Grab</u>', this is the easiest and most affordable way to move around in Vietnam. Make sure to download the app, and set up an account, before you leave. Grabs are available from the Grab Depot, which is well signed. Taxis are also available from the Taxi rank which is well signed.

Vietnam Visa Information

The <u>Vietnamese visa</u> is a kind of travel document granted by Vietnamese competent authorities, providing permission to travel to and enter Vietnam.

An electronic visa (E-visa) is one of the visa types issued to foreigners by the Vietnamese Immigration Department via an electronic system. Vietnam's E-visa is valid for a maximum of 90 days, single or multiple entry. Foreigners who want to enter Vietnam can <u>personally apply for E-visa here</u>. E-visa fee is paid via an electronic payment gateway as prescribed by the Immigration Department. The fee will not be refunded if the application is refused.

For the Australia-Vietnam Green Economy Summit, you will require a Tourist Visa. When applying for this Visa, please make sure that your name and contact information match the information on your official documentation/passport. If there are any differences (for example: different spelling, wrong order of names, or missing middle name), you will be denied entry into Vietnam.

Once your Visa has arrived, please make sure to check all your information is correct. If you need any support with your Visa, you can contact evisa@immigration.gov.vn*, however, we would recommend re-applying for another Visa, as there can be delays in receiving a response. If there are concerns about your Visa at an Australian airport, purchase an emergency Visa while in Australia. You may be eligible for an emergency Visa once you arrive in Vietnam, however, this isn't always achievable and can be very expensive. If this does happen, you will need to speak to one of the 'travel agents' at immigration.?

*Please note that this email is monitored by the Vietnamese Government. Asialink cannot support in Visa applications.
